Acts 9:17 So Ananias departed and entered the house, and after laying his hands on him said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road by which you were coming, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

Acts 2:4 And they were all **filled with the Holy Spirit** and **began to speak** with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance.

Water baptism is important:

- 1. It publicly proclaims that we have become members of God's family.
- 2. It is a testimony of our salvation. It is an outward sign that symbolizes an inward change.
- 3. It marks a change in ownership and allegiance.






23 When many days had elapsed, the Jews plotted together to do away with him,



God's blessing on Saul's life:




26 When he came to Jerusalem, he was trying to associate with the disciples; but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple.

God's blessing on Saul's life:




28 And he was with them, moving about freely in Jerusalem, speaking out boldly in the name of the Lord.

29 And he was talking and arguing with the Hellenistic Jews; but they were attempting to put him to death.


