<u>1 John 5:13</u> – These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

<u>John 20:31</u> – but these have been written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing you may have life in His name.

<u>1 John 2:19</u> – They went out from us, but they were not really of us; for if they had been of us, they would have remained with us; but they went out, so that it would be shown that they all are not of us.
