## **Key features of salvation:**

## 1. God initiates and sovereignly orchestrates salvation.

Acts 2:39 "For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself."

## 2. Salvation requires the choice of human will.

Acts 2:40 And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on *exhorting* them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation!"

Acts 10:34–35 Opening his mouth, Peter said: "I most certainly understand now that God is not one to show partiality, 35 but in every nation the man who fears Him and does what is right is welcome to Him.

"fears Him" / "does what is right"

Acts 10:36-43 "The word which He sent to the sons of Israel, preaching peace through Jesus Christ (He is Lord of all)— 37 you yourselves know the thing which took place throughout all Judea, starting from Galilee, after the baptism which John proclaimed. 38 "You know of Jesus of Nazareth, how God anointed Him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and how He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. 39 "We are witnesses of all the things He did both in the land of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They also put Him to death by hanging Him on a cross.

40 "God raised Him up on the third day and granted that He become visible, 41 not to all the people, but to witnesses who were chosen beforehand by God, that is, to us who ate and drank with Him after He arose from the dead. 42 "And He ordered us to preach to the people, and solemnly to testify that this is the One who has been appointed by God as Judge of the living and the dead. 43 "Of Him all the prophets bear witness that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins."

Romans 10:17 So faith comes from *hearing*, and hearing by *the word* of Christ.

"peace"

Romans 5:10 For if while we were <u>enemies</u> we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.

Ephesians 2:3 Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were <u>by nature</u> children of wrath, even as the rest.

John 3:36 "He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who <u>does not obey</u> the Son will not see life, but the <u>wrath of God</u> abides on him."

"Peace"- [eirene] - To bind together than which has been separated.

## How does the gospel restore our peace with God?

Romans 5:1 Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have *peace with God* through our Lord Jesus Christ,

"justified"

Justification is "a declaration of God by which those who
are unrighteous in themselves are nevertheless
righteous before God



The doctrine of

Romans 5:18 So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted *justification* of life to all men.

"all men" is qualified by verse 17

Romans 5:17 For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more <u>those who</u> <u>receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of</u> <u>righteousness</u> will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 15:5–8 and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; 7 then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles; 8 and last of all, as to one untimely born, He appeared to me also.
