There is full _____

<u>Luke 11:32</u> – The men of Nineveh will stand up with this generation at the judgment and condemn it, because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and behold, something greater than Jonah is here.

- o God's response
 - He sees their repentance and doesn't carry out His judgment.
 - Does God change His mind?

<u>Jer. 18:7–8</u> – At one moment I might speak concerning a nation or concerning a kingdom to uproot, to pull down, or to destroy it; ⁸ if that nation against which I have spoken turns from its evil, I will relent concerning the calamity I planned to bring on it.
