Response

- Jonah reveals his main reason for fleeing before.
  - He knew God might save the Ninevites. (cf. Joel 2:13; Ex. 34:6–7)
  - He was actively working \_\_\_\_\_\_ what he thought God's will was.
  - He missed the point of Gen. 22:18a

<u>2 Pet. 3:9</u> – The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance.

<u>2 Tim. 2:25–26</u> – with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth, <sup>26</sup>and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will.

<u>Matt. 9:36–38</u> – Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd. <sup>37</sup>Then He \*said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. <sup>38</sup>Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest."
