- 1. Learn from Peter's example:
 - a. We can trust God to grow us into full maturity.
 - b. We aren't 'too insignificant' for God, and we shouldn't treat anyone else that way.
 - c. We should meditate on our place as 'elect sojourners' and look for how God is calling us to live differently in light of it.
 - d. We should thank God that we enjoy His grace and peace and wish them on others.

- 4. How is it helpful to identify grace and peace as our greatest needs? How is that different from how the rest of the world views religion, as well as life in general?
