Matt. 24:6–7 – You will be hearing of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not frightened, for those things must take place, but that is not yet the end. ⁷For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and in various places there will be famines and earthquakes.

- **The People Who Will _____ It (vv6–8)**

- Micah ties the future nation to the biblical concept of the _____.
- He echoes the language of rescue from 2:12–13.
 - God is still their Shepherd/King.
 - God is the One Who afflicted them and the One Who will restore them.
- They will become the strong nation God rules.

- **Israel's _____ in the Meantime (vv9–10)**

- Before blessing, they will endure judgment for their unrepentance.
- This is tied back to failing _____.
- God will not only *not* abandon them there, but He will actually rescue them from there.

- **The Fate of Her _____ (vv11–13)**
 - This scene will be ultimately fulfilled in the Battle of _____ (cf. Zech. 14; Rev. 16:16; 19:19).

 - Bless His people
 - Vindicate His name
