## The Eight Visions of Zechariah's Second Prophecy

- 3. The Measuring Line: Jerusalem will be rebuilt into a multiethnic capital where God will dwell among His people

<u>Is. 11:1</u> – Then a shoot will spring from the stem of Jesse,
And a <b>branch</b> from his roots will bear fruit.
<u>Jer. 23:5</u> – "Behold, the days are coming," declares the Lord,
"When I will raise up for David a righteous <b>Branch</b> ;
And He will reign as king and act wisely
And do justice and righteousness in the land.
<ul> <li>The stone refers back to the (cf. Ex. 28).</li> </ul>
This is a picture of what the Ultimate Priest will wear to represent
His people.
<ul> <li>The seven eyes are most likely a reference to the</li> </ul>
(cf. 4:10).
<u>Rev. 5:6</u> – And I saw between the throne (with the four living creatures) and
the elders a Lamb standing, as if slain, having seven horns and seven eyes,
which are the seven Spirits of God, sent out into all the earth.

o 'Under his vine and under his fig tree' is a reference to the Millennial

Kingdom (cf. 1 Ki. 4:25; Mic. 4:4).

Main Idea: Joshua being fit to stand before God to represent Israel to atone
for sin was only a picture of the ultimate priesthood that would one day
actually, effectively remove sin.
